4.2 REQUEST TO BUILD A HANGAR ON LEASE SITE 26

PURPOSE

To discuss a request to build a hangar on Site 46.

DISCUSSION

Tony Orr of Helisika Ltd currently leases Site 45. Attached to this report is a letter outlining his request to build a hangar on the adjacent site (No. 46) to house a fixed wing aircraft. This arrangement would allow the aircraft to be towed from the hangar to the airside to be started instead of doing this at the hangar.

The proposed site area is already level, and would only require a general tidy-up and removal of a small section of fence to enable construction of the hangar. If approved by the TAA, Mr Orr would be responsible for all associated costs, compliance and maintenance requirements necessary to facilitate the hangar build.

The area is currently only used by helicopter traffic. However, roading access to the site will need to be looked at as the site was surveyed prior to the airport zone changes.

CONCLUSION

Granting the request would allow an existing lessee to operate an aeroplane from an adjacent site with relatively easy access to the runways. The original master plan for the airport also included the future allowance of a variety of aircraft types in this particular area.

RECOMMENDATION(S)

That the Taupō Airport Authority Committee agrees in principle to Mr Orr's request and allows a hangar to be built on Site 46 for house of a fixed wing aircraft subject to acceptance by the Taupo Airport Operational Safety Committee and compliance with any road requirements.

4.5 SAFETY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (SMS) UPDATE

PURPOSE

This report outlines the implementation process of the Safety Management Systems (SMS) as required by the Civil Aviation Authority (CAA).

DISCUSSION

All certificated aviation organisations are now required to meet Civil Aviation Rule Part 100, Safety Management Systems (SMS). The ICAO definition of SMS is:

“A systematic approach to managing safety, including the necessary organisational structures, accountabilities, policies and procedures”

There are 13 elements to the SMS, which are outlined in the attached plan (Attachment 1). Airports are required to have their SMS fully operational by June 2018.

In the interim, airports are required to develop a plan which includes a GAP analysis to show what stage we are currently at in relation to the SMS. Once completed, CAA approval must then be sought prior to implementation of the plan.

Taupō Airport have been well ahead for a number of years in terms of SMS planning, which our procedures demonstrate. However, we have had to hold off putting our plan together until the CAA had confirmed what was required both in the plan and in practice. CAA have held a series of roadshows to clarify plan requirements in more detail, of which I have attended three to date.

A small working group has been established to oversee the development of the SMS plan which should be completed for submission to CAA before Christmas 2017.

A copy of the TAA Safety Management Systems Manual is also attached (Attachment 2).
