DISCUSSION

Waikato Region Civil Defence Group Emergency Management Plan

The Waikato Region has adopted the Waikato Region Civil Defence Group Emergency Management Plan. A detailed work plan is being worked on for the region and Council will develop a detailed work programme and performance targets that reflect this. For example, a target might be the number of communities with Response Plans within the District.

Waiau 21 November – 2 December MCDEM Deployment Kaikoura Earthquake

Assisted with running the Waiau CD Sector post operations; organize contractors to help with repairs on property from yellow sticker to white sticker; make hazard areas safe. Organize water tankers to supply farms and properties with drinking water. Assist Mt Lyford community. Deliver food parcels to farmers and gather welfare intel. Arrange sanitation solutions, mobile showers and porta loos. Welfare of community and directing people to correct agencies at welfare center. Organizing volunteers with work programmes. Help with road cordons.

Neighborhood Community Events

Attended the following neighborhood events: Hilltop Twilight Market gala, Pihanga Christmas in the park, Kinloch Christmas in the park, Turangi Christmas in the park.

Civil Defence Educational and Publicity Programmes

Focus is on being prepared, with several mediums to back up the advertising on national TV. We are attending the Neighborhood community events, radio and newspaper advertising as well as running adverts at Starlight Cinema which play before every movie.

Rural Fire

Providing assistance to the Rural Fire Manager fighting fires (refer to Rural Fire Manager's Report)

DISCUSSION

Fire Season

As at 31 January 2017, 345 fire permits have been issued. In comparison 397 permits were issued for the whole of the previous fire season.

Between 1 November and 31 January myself and Rural Fire Volunteers have attended 31 fire callouts which were predominantly small but included 2 structures and 29 vegetation (Mapara Rd was multiple fires (5) deliberately lit but counted as one; two on one day at the equestrian centre; a Wairakei pastoral farm fire; and a large fire at Ohaaki over multiple days with a possible claim on the National Rural Fire Fighting Fund)

Attended Emergency Services Coordinating committee meeting in Taupō and met with Fire and Emergency NZ to discuss position change to FENZ from Council.

Current Issues

A priority going forward is training and recruitment as there is a shortage of volunteers currently.

4.5 MINISTERIAL AWARD NOMINATION FOR MR S HOWARD

PURPOSE

For the Committee to approve a nomination for ex Local Controller Shamus Howard to receive a ministerial award for services to Civil Defence and Emergency Management.

DISCUSSION

Mr Howard was appointed by Council as Civil Defence Controller for the Taupō District in February 2002.

He vacated this role in 2016 due to his moving to the Tauranga region.

During this time he contributed significantly to the development and growth of Civil Defence and Emergency Management not only within the district but also within the region.

Also during this time Mr Howard was the Controller at the time of the declaration of a state of emergency for the Waihi Hill/ Hipaua event of 2009. This was a significant event and the first statutory declaration for any event in the history of Council. As a result of this event Mr Howard was pivotal in gaining support and financial commitments from a number of external stakeholder agencies to an ongoing scientific monitoring programme for the landslide hazards in the area. Those arrangements remain to this day.

Additionally this event took place at the ancestral home for Tūwharetoa and Mr Howard's role as Controller enhanced relationships that also continue to this day.

The Minister of Civil Defence at the time the Rt Hon John Carter in speaking about this event said "they have given me confidence in New Zealanders, and should be an example of how to act in a Civil Defence emergency".

The Ministry of Civil Defence and Emergency Management have now opened nominations for the 2017 Ministerial Awards. Nominations close in March/ April 2017.

CONCLUSION

It is considered that Mr Howard's service and contribution as a civil defence controller for the Taupō District Council and the community is fully deserving of a nomination for a ministerial award for Civil Defence and Emergency Management in 2017.

RECOMMENDATION(S)
