4.3 UPDATE ON THE PRE-DRAFT CONSULTATION, FEEDBACK AND PROPOSED DIRECTION OF THE TURANGI RESERVES MANAGEMENT PLAN

The Senior Policy Advisor provided an update of the process to date and outlined the key issues that had been received as part of the first round of consultation. The next stage of the process is the development of the draft Reserve Management Plan which would be based on the feedback received, and direction from this committee.

Members expressed concerns regarding reducing the number of smaller neighbourhood reserves as the majority were well used and removing them could break down the cohesiveness of the neighbourhoods and, the focus on reducing or removing services (such as toilets) rather than improving them, in particular the Turangitukua Sports Park. Clarification on what was meant by 'reduced maintenance' was sought and would that result in deterioration of the reserves as weeds, broome etc may flourish. The theme of the plan should not be about reducing services but instead be about invigorating community connections as neighbourhoods needed to be cohesive.

In terms of the potential return of land, the Charitable Trust would need to be involved and discussions held to agree on what state it needed to be in prior to any handing back.

It was noted that the schools grounds were being used more frequently by sports clubs due to small clubs struggling. Centralisation of the various clubs meant they could use the school facilities such as toilets and changing rooms.

The draft Management Plan would come back to the committee in July prior to going out for public consultation.

An early draft report would be circulated in May so that members could see the framework and direction.
