Turangi Operations Update - April:

- Heavy rainfall in the first week of April caused minor flooding issues around Turangi and slips
 on Pukawa Road resulting in considerable damage. There was also further bank erosion in
 the Kohineheke Reserve area due to increased water levels on the Tongariro River. Higher
 lake levels also put further pressure on the areas susceptible to lakeshore erosion.
 Cyclone Cook arrived on the 13th April further exacerbating damage from the earlier rainfall
 event. As a precautionary measure in preparation for Cook's arrival, the team sandbagged
 the frontages of some lower-lying properties at Kuratau.
- The Taupo Women's Club brought two bus loads of members to Turangi for a tour of the Turangi-Tongariro ward. Staff accompanied the tour group and lunch was provided at the Turangi office.
- There have been a number of blockages at the Motuoapa Boating Club toilets this month.
 Initially there was a problem with the tank system followed by individual drainage lines.
- The Jujitsu Club were asked to vacate the Pihanga Clubrooms at Turangitukua Park following a building WoF inspection and successive overall condition assessment. The building was deemed unsafe for public use at the current time.
- · Additional skip bins for green waste only were provided for Pukawa residents over Easter.
- Some interior paintwork was touched up prior to re-letting pensioner unit 3 following the sad passing of long term resident Mrs Mihi Adams.
- Several parks and reserves staff have been on leave at varying times over April as regular activities slow down prior and the leaf fall and winter project work commences.
