A meeting may deal with (i.e. make a resolution in respect of) an item of business not on the agenda only if the procedures set out in Standing Order 9.12 are followed.

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5.2 UPDATE ON THE 2025 LOCAL GOVERNMENT ELECTIONS AND DISCUSSION ON COMMITTEE STRUCTURE, TERMS OF REFERENCE AND DELEGATIONS

TE PŪTAKE | PURPOSE

To receive an update on this year's local government elections and to discuss the Kinloch Representative Group's current terms of reference and delegations with a view to capturing any suggestions for change following the elections.

NGĀ KŌRERORERO | DISCUSSION

This year's local government elections will take place on 11 October. All electors will vote for the Mayor. Councillors will be elected via wards as follows:

- Two councillors elected by the electors of the Te Papamārearea Māori Ward;
- One councillor elected by the electors of Mangakino-Pouakani General Ward;
- One councillor elected by the electors of Taupō East Rural Ward;
- Seven councillors elected by the electors of Taupō General Ward; and
- One councillor elected by the electors of Tūrangi-Tongariro General Ward.

Nominations for these election issues will open on Friday 4 July and close at noon on Friday 1 August 2025.

The elections will be conducted by postal vote between Tuesday 9 September and noon on Saturday 11 October 2025. In addition to the election of the Mayor and councillors, there will be a poll relating to Council's Te Papamārearea Māori Ward, with voters being asked whether they vote to keep or remove the ward. The outcome of the poll will apply to the 2028 and 2031 elections.

All current committees are deemed to be discharged at the end of the current Triennium, unless Council resolves otherwise (clause 30, Schedule 7, Local Government Act 2002 "LGA"). Following the elections, the Mayor has the power to establish committees (s 41A, LGA) and in practice, this is usually done via recommendation to a full Council meeting. The Kinloch Representative Group may wish to make recommendations for improvements to the current structure, including terms of reference and delegations (attached), and / or to confirm what is working well. Any comments will be captured by staff, collated and provided to the new group of elected members for consideration following the elections.

Kinloch Reservoir

Following this meeting, a Kinloch Reservoir community engagement session will be held at the Community Hall.

Colour-Coded Dog Tag Idea

According to the Compliance and Regulatory Manager, registration tag colours are determined by the Department of Internal Affairs and change each year. It could potentially be difficult to differentiate registration tags from dog safety tags and could become a safety issue if people approach a dog on the mistaken belief that their tag colour denoted this was acceptable.

There is a movement to have colour-coded leashes but it is not enforceable and could also be a safety issue if someone unknowingly walked their dog with the wrong leash colour.

Whangamata Road Signs

The team will have a look at putting in larger signs for the 60km section on Whangamata Road and will consider threshold treatments but will hold off on implementation of these until we have undertaken our next round of speed limit reviews 12 to 18mths.

Water Treatment Plant Upgrade

The project is progressing well, we anticipate that by the time this meeting occurs we will likely be producing from the new plant with water that is compliant with the NZ Drinking water standards

Kinloch Commercial Centre

The commercial centre had one submission in opposition through the limited notification process. The submission has been withdrawn and no hearing is required. A decision to grant the consent should be issued the week of 4 August.

Seven Oaks Hearing

The Seven Oaks hearing is scheduled for 27 and 28 August with information on the website. The hearing is at Council Chambers starting from 10am on 27 August.
