5.2 OPERATIONS UPDATE

The General Manager Airport summarised the report and the following points were explained:

- The asphalt on the southern apron was roughly 22mm thick and it should be 50mm.
- The two-yearly full emergency exercise had been held which was based on an unruly passenger in the airport terminal. All airport staff complied with the procedures for such an event and an Air New Zealand staff member did very well to defuse the situation. There had been three previous events of unruly passengers in the past year so this was an important topic to be used for the exercise.

In answer to questions, the following was clarified:

- The southern apron had been installed a long time ago.
- The leak in the old water tank had not been repaired previously as the plan had been to decommission and remove the tank in 2030, however once it became a serious concern then action was required.
- Different scenarios had been used for previous emergency exit exercise including a hijacking. Officers tried to hold the exercises based on scenarios they had identified as current issues.
- The scenario was conducted after the Air New Zealand flight had left but with some public still in the terminal.

5.8 JOINT VENTURE AIRPORTS

The General Manager Airport summarised the report and explained that in other countries, governments would subsidise seats on planes to help establish connectivity with regional ports. The General Manager Strategy and Environment explained he had a meeting with Member of Parliament Mr Shane Jones who explained that airlines like Sounds Air and Originair would be eligible for the loan referred to in the report.

In answer to questions, the following was explained:

- The \$30 million was a loan specifically for airline maintenance and capital expenditure and not for airports or passenger seat subsidies.
- The General Manager Airport was trying to work with the Ministry of Transport (MoT) regarding funding for airports.
- Airlines would need to pay the loan back to the Government.

Members thanked the General Manager Airport for building a stronger relationship with MoT.

- The trees were on Council land.
- The work was scheduled to be completed in the new year.

It was suggested to remove the trees in the middle of the airport landside area adjacent Anzac Memorial Drive at the same time.
