3 CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES

4.1 TAUPO AIRPORT AUTHORITY MONTHLY FINANCIAL REPORT - MARCH 2019

It was noted that the only line items that had increased were for Airbiz consultant fees work on the Statement of Intent (SOI), which was anticipated.

In answer to a further question, the General Manager – Taupō Airport advised that Airbiz fees were within budget, with only one invoice outstanding.

The Chair advised that for clarification, line items were more detailed than previous SOIs which was preferred by the Ministry of Transport. Outcomes from a workshop undertaken a few years ago on the vision for the airport had also been integrated into the final document.

In answer to a question, the Economic Relationship Manager advised that SOI formatting by default did not include organisation visions hence the reason it was not featured in the document.

A member congratulated those people involved in putting together the SOI, which was very clear.

4.3 UPDATE ON COMMUNICATIONS WITH AIR NEW ZEALAND

The Economic Relationship Manager advised that she had recently met with Air New Zealand (Air NZ) representatives in Auckland along with chair Chris Johnston and finance manager Neil Ward, to discuss airport developments including financial modelling and quantum of investment into the terminal and apron development. Air NZ had been provided with Beca reports to review; upcoming discussions would focus on detailed design of the terminal and Air NZs requirements.

The Head of Economic Development & Business Transformation advised that there were some accounting complexities regarding government funding, and a potential joint application to the Provincial Growth Fund (PGF) between TAA and the Ministry of Transport (MoT) was being tested with the PDU. Ensuing discussions included members commending those people involved with advancing the relationship with MoT to the current point whereby MoT saw merit in entering into a joint venture with TAA, which was a significant achievement.

The Economic Relationship Manager also advised that:

- Conversations with Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment (MBIE) continued to be positive.
- Meeting with Under Secreatry for regional development Fletcher Tabuteau (tomorrow).
- Planned visit from Hon. Kelvin Davis on May 16 interested in looking at Taupō Airport operations.

- AirBiz were very experienced in design and modelling efficiencies.

4.4 GENERAL MANAGER'S OPERATIONS REPORT

The General Manager – Taupō Airport presented his (final) operations report, and highlighted key points as follows:

- Continual high load factors were ahead by a decent margin, which contradicted current trends for Air New Zealand.
- Aircraft and skydiver movements had slowed up with changing weather conditions.
- Taupō was one of the first small regional airports to receive full SMS certification from CAA. Recertification would need to be applied for again in July 2019.
- The concrete pad for the generator had been installed. However, due to installation costs being substantially under-estimated, the installation was put on hold whilst Council sought the required \$41k funding through its annual plan. The generator would have a switching system that separated the terminal and fuel pump.
- Wild pigs were an ongoing problem.
- Airways had re-surveyed the runway, and advised of rubber removal that needed to be done. That work
 had been pushed out due to budget constraints, but would be attended to in the near future.

The Airport Safety Manager advised that a meeting had been held with Sounds Air earlier today to discuss the current MOU and that the clause relating to the intent of the MOU was currently being reworded. There was also discussion around commencing regular six-monthly catch-ups between both parties.

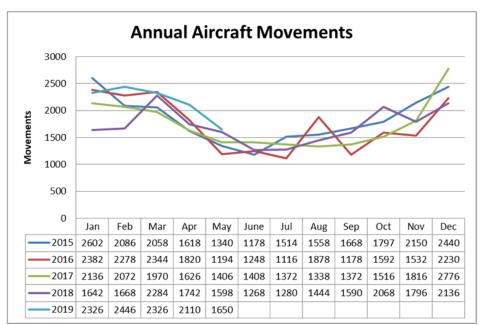

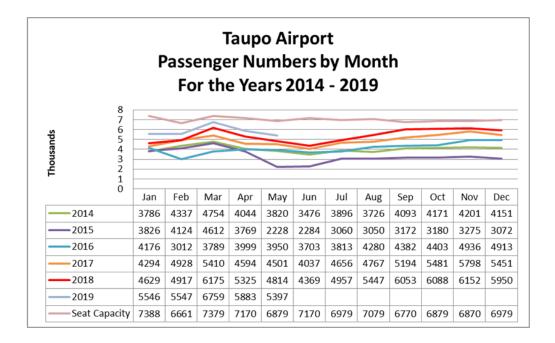

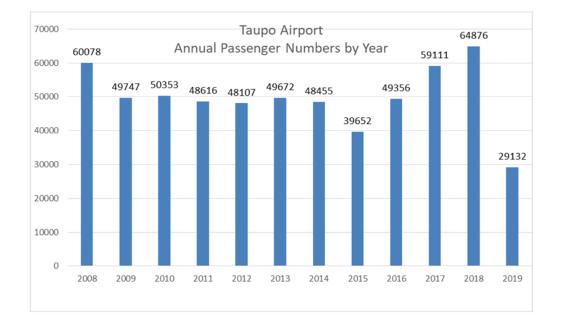

General Manager's Update

Civil Aviation Part 100 Safety Management System Certification

System for Safety Management accepted by CAA – approval shared with airport community.

Civil Aviation Part 139 Recertification Audit

This audit is scheduled for 17 June 2019 including senior person's interview.

Memorandum of Understanding

This document is still work in progress

Landing Charges Review

The landing charge review is required this year as the last rate was set in 2014. It is timely to progress the proposed SLA's as they form part of the overall leases. Landing charges also can be a function of leases.

Air BP AVGAS underground Tank

As ongoing maintenance Air BP will be removing their underground AVGAS tank and replacing it with a new tank. This is planned for the last quarter of this year.

Runway Paint Markings

Airways have scheduled the repainting of the runway markings for mid-June. There was some discussion regarding rubber removal however as there is minimal rubber build up, TAA will build this into their summer maintenance programme.

Apron Crack Bandaging

To increase the longevity of the apron TAA have engaged with a contractor who has completed crack bandaging. This will help to alleviate asphalt join splits and water retention.

Aircraft Movement and Passenger Numbers

Both movement and passenger numbers are showing an increase from the same period last year.
